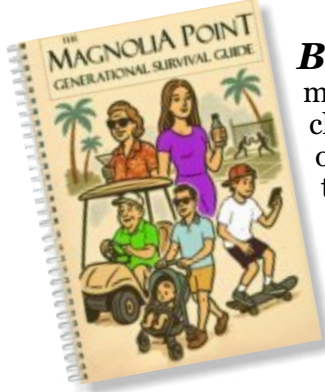


Generational Survival Guide - *Chapter 4: Turf Wars*

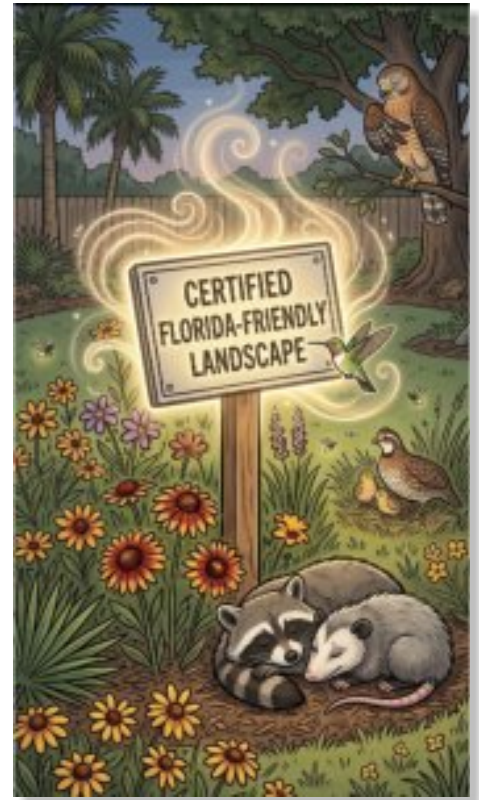
3. The Illumination Device
